

Weather Events & Outages

We know that our Pacific Northwest weather can be unpredictable. Please take a few minutes to review the information below so you know what to expect when there is a weather event or power outage during a school day.



WEATHER EVENTS

District announcements will be made to staff and families via SchoolMessenger (phone and/or email), district website, and Facebook.

In the event that snow or other weather conditions make it unsafe to report to school buildings, learning will not stop. There will be no snow days or late start due to snow or weather events. We will transition to complete distance learning and the expectation is that students will continue to work on assignments.



Hybrid and Small Onsite Groups

There will not be in-person instruction for hybrid and small onsite groups. Students can participate in distance learning opportunities for the day.

Special Education services for students in specialized programs

There will not be in-person special education instruction. Teachers will reach out to these families with distance learning opportunities for the day.

Pre-School

Pre-School will be closed for in-person learning. Teachers will reach out to these families with distance learning opportunities for the day.



POWER AND INTERNET OUTAGES

If you lose power or Internet at home, please do the following, if possible:

- Try to reconnect if power comes back on.
- When possible, contact your teacher or the school to report the outage.
- Continue to work on previously assigned learning activities.

If your teacher loses power or internet at home, please do the following:

- Wait 3-5 minutes for your teacher to reconnect
- If the teacher is unable to connect, continue working on previously assigned learning activities.
- We will still be able to count the day as a school day as long as students have assignments available.

Employees: If you lose power or Internet at home, please do the following, if possible:

- Contact your principal or supervisor to report the outage.
- Teachers send a message to students to engage in distance learning activities, If you are unable to send a message, ask your principal or supervisor to do this for you.
- If the power or Internet goes out during class, contact your principal or supervisor and ask that a message be shared with your students. Students should continue to work on learning activities.
