Emergency Response Preparedness


- During the week of July 17-20, 2023, deputies from the Snohomish County Sheriff's Office (SCSO), School Resource Officers, Law Enforcement from several area agencies came together to train with the ALERRT (Advanced Law Enforcement Rapid Response - Texas State University) program at Stanwood High School.
- SCSO School Services Unit Deputies are now certified to train the CRASE Course (Civilian Response to Active Shooter Events).
- SCSO School Services Unit hopes to bring additional ALERRT training to the school next summer, training more geared to a SINGLE OFFICER response to an active shooter or event. (Rather than a small team engagement).
